### **Trip Registration**

Pre-registration is required for all trips.

Registration will open Wednesday, November 29, 2023, at 6:00 a.m. online and 10:00 a.m. over the phone.

- · Lift ticket and transportation is \$99 per participant.
- Registration must be received at the Parks & Recreation office by 4:30 pm on the Tuesday prior to that Friday's trip.
- Must register for trips that your student's school are attending
- · A receipt will be emailed as confirmation.
- · If a trip is full, you will be notified and placed on a waitlist.
- · Registered participants MUST ride the bus to & from the ski area.

<u>WAIVER</u>: Completion of the waiver needs to occur once per season for rentals & lift tickets and is valid for the season at all ski hills.

# **Equipment Rental**

Ski and Snowboard equipment rentals are available for participants. An additional fee of \$28 will need to be purchased during registration. Helmet is included with equipment rental fee.

**Helmets** are strongly recommended and available to rent at the ski areas. If you are bringing your own equipment and wish to rent a helmet the fees are paid during the registration process as an additional \$10.

# Lessons are required for beginners on their first trip

The cost is included in trip fees. Please note in your registration that student will take a lesson.

# **Equipment Storage at Ski Area**

Students are responsible for their equipment!
All locations have a low-cost equipment storage corral to put equipment when not in use. A small fee applies to use the corral. Student will need to bring money for this usage.

## **Equipment Storage at School**

A locked storage area for student equipment will be available for students at their respective schools. Equipment must be dropped off and stored **before the start of the school day on Friday**. Below are the storage locations for each school.

- · WEMS: Community Girls Locker Room
- · WCMS: Lower Level C between Ryberg and Caspar
- · **WWMS:** Lower Level by Industrial Tech. (ETD Storage)

**Ski or snowboard bags are required** to protect your equipment during transit. **Boldly label & ID your bag.** The Ski & Snowboard club is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items.

#### **Emergency Procedures**

When registering, please indicate a home, work and cell number for parent/guardian and an alternate emergency contact other than the parent. In the event of an injury, the area ski patrol will provide immediate first aid and the ski area's emergency procedures will be followed. Staff/Ski patrol will contact parent/emergency contact. Parent is responsible for student once transported by emergency management. If the injury is not severe, a parent/guardian may pick up the child at the ski area prior to bus departure, or the student may be transported on the bus.

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### **Bus Departure**

Students meet at the school storage area following school dismissal. The busses will load and depart as soon as the school route buses leave.

#### **Bus Return**

p.m. from the Trips to Trollhaugen and Wild Mountain. Trips from Powder Ridge and Welch will return by 10:30 p.m. Students will contact rides 15 minutes prior to arrival. A late pick-up fee of \$10 will be assessed, plus an additional \$5 for every 15 minutes you are late for pick-up. Program registration will be denied after the 2nd late pick-up. The late fee must be paid before participation in the next trip.

The school will be locked when we return, so transportation must be pre-arranged. For their own safety, teens are not allowed to walk home after trips

### **Special Needs**

Please note any special needs (ex. ADHD, asthma, hearing impaired, medication, etc.) when registering and inclusion needs.

### **Cancellation/Weather Policy**

A trip may be cancelled due to insufficient enrollment or if the wind-chill is 15 degrees below zero (based on the National Weather Service wind-chill formula).

- · If there is insufficient enrollment, the decision will be made on Wednesday.
- Weather decisions are made on Friday based upon the forecast for the trip location and on transportation considerations, utilizing the National Weather Service and the Weather Channel.
- If a trip is cancelled, a notice will be posted on the Parks & Recreation weather line 763-509-5205.
- Announcements will be made at school in accordance with their policies.
  - Full refunds will be issued if the trip is cancelled by Parks & Recreation.

### At the Ski Area

- Upon arrival, announcements will be made by trip advisors and staff - ask questions if you did not hear the announcements.
- It the student's responsibility to know when the bus leaves the ski area a time for loading will always be **announced**. Individuals who return late from the slopes may have their enrollment suspended for a trip. Chronic tardiness will lead to membership termination.
- · Memorize the bus loading time and bus number.
- Students will remain on the bus while Staff pick up lift tickets and rental forms, and unload equipment. Lift tickets will be distributed on the bus.
- · If you bring your own snowboard, leashes are mandatory at the ski areas to ride the lift.
- · If student is renting equipment, pick up rental form from chaperone and follow to rental pick up area.

### **Code of Conduct**
